Os advogados da Fuerza Immigration Lawyers, LLP, prepararam as seguintes informações para fornecer orientação caso você tenha contato com o Departamento de Imigração e Alfândega (ICE). Esta informação é geral e não se destina a ser aconselhamento jurídico para qualquer indivíduo em particular. Se você tiver perguntas específicas sobre o seu caso, marque uma consulta com seu advogado para discutir suas preocupações.

OBJETIVO # 1: EVITAR O ICE

Há lugares onde você corre maior risco de ser detido pelo ICE.

- Se você souber de ataques ou operações do ICE em sua área, evite-os. Muitos condados da Califórnia têm Redes de Resposta Rápida, onde você pode ligar para relatar avistamentos de imigração. Você pode encontrar a Linha Direta de Resposta Rápida do seu condado aqui: https://www.ccijustice.org/rapid-response
- Evite viajar perto da fronteira EUA-México e EUA-Canadá. Um regulamento federal permite que agentes da Alfândega e Proteção de Fronteiras (CBP) sem mandado entrem e revistem ônibus, trens, barcos e aeronaves dentro de 100 milhas de uma fronteira terrestre ou marítima. Além disso, o CBP tem autoridade para realizar paradas e buscas de indivíduos e veículos dentro de 100 milhas da fronteira.
- Devido a questões de segurança, os aeroportos também são áreas onde o ICE está frequentemente presente.
 Mesmo se você estiver viajando dentro do país, os agentes da TSA que estão verificando a identificação podem entrar em contato com o ICE se tiverem motivos para acreditar que o passageiro não está em situação legal.
- Não carregue documentos estrangeiros. Isso inclui passaportes estrangeiros e carteiras de identidade.

Não cometa crimes.

Certas prisões e condenações criminais são consideradas tão graves sob a lei de imigração que você pode ser colocado sob custódia do ICE. Além disso, as condenações por certos crimes podem torná-lo inelegível para alívio de imigração.

- Se você for preso pela polícia, você tem o direito de permanecer em silêncio e falar com um advogado. Nunca aceite um acordo judicial ou assine qualquer coisa sem saber como a condenação pode afetar seu status de imigração.
- Não carreque, venda, compre ou transporte produtos de maconha ou substâncias controladas.
- Não trabalhe na indústria da maconha. Embora o uso de maconha seja legal na Califórnia, ela permanece classificada como uma droga da Tabela I sob a Lei de Substâncias Controladas. Trabalhar na indústria da maconha, mesmo como zelador, empacotador ou assistente administrativo, pode torná-lo inelegível para alívio da imigração e levar à detenção do ICE.
- Se você não é cidadão dos Estados Unidos, não compre, venda, possua, carregue, branda ou dispare armas de fogo. Isso inclui a solicitação de licenças de caça e licenças de porte oculto.
- Dirigir sob a influência (DUI), violência doméstica, roubo, assassinato e furto também são crimes graves que também podem resultar na prisão de um indivíduo pelo ICE.

OBJETIVO #2: EVITAR A DETENÇÃO

O que fazer se você tiver contato com o ICE na rua:

- Fique calmo e <u>não</u> corra. Se você correr, estará dando aos funcionários do ICE uma causa provável para detêlo. Se você vir ICE, caminhe calmamente até um lugar onde se sinta seguro.
- Você tem o direito de permanecer em silêncio. Você não precisa falar com os oficiais de imigração, responder a perguntas ou apresentar documentos. Forneça ao oficial de imigração o cartão vermelho que detalha seus direitos constitucionais que está incluído neste pacote.
- Pergunte se você está sendo detido, se não, faça valer seu direito de permanecer em silêncio e ir embora.

O que fazer se o ICE estiver em sua casa:

- NÃO ABRA A PORTA. Se você tem filhos pequenos em casa, é importante dizer-lhes para não abrirem a porta, a menos que um adulto esteja presente.
- Você não precisa abrir a porta ou deixar os policiais entrarem em sua casa, a menos que eles tenham um mandado de busca válido assinado por um juiz. Peça aos policiais que deslizem o mandado por baixo de uma porta ou janela.
 Se o mandado não tiver seu nome e endereço corretos e não for assinado por um juiz, você não precisa abrir a porta.
- Consulte a amostra anexa de um mandado judicial válido para referência. Se os oficiais do ICE não tiverem esse documento, eles não terão o direito de entrar e revistar sua casa. Mesmo que esperem horas do lado de fora, mantenha a calma e não abra a porta. Ligue para o seu advogado!

OBJETIVO #3: EVITAR REMOÇÃO ACELERADA E SAÍDA VOLUNTÁRIA

"Detido" significa que o ICE o algemou e está dizendo que você está detido.

- Se você estiver detido e tiver um caso de imigração pendente:
 - o Não minta.
 - Forneça informações sobre seu caso de imigração pendente: uma cópia do seu aviso de recebimento ou sua permissão de trabalho.
 - o Mostre evidências de que você está nos EUA há pelo menos dois anos.
 - o Se a Fuerza Immigration Lawyers, LLP representa você, apresente um de nossos cartões de visita.
 - o Permaneça em silêncio e não forneça informações. Peça para falar com seu advogado.
 - o Peça para ver um juiz de imigração.
 - o Certifique-se de que seu nome esteja escrito corretamente e de que você forneça sua data de nascimento
 - NÃO ASSINE NADA SEM FALAR COM UM ADVOGADO DE IMIGRAÇÃO
- Se você estiver detido e não tiver um pedido pendente:
 - o Permaneça em silêncio e não forneça informações. Peça para falar com um advogado.
 - o Peça para ver um juiz de imigração.
 - NÃO ASSINE NADA SEM FALAR COM UM ADVOGADO
- Informações adicionais que você pode fornecer ao ICE se estiver detido:
 - o Se você tem filhos menores da USC, informe o ICE imediatamente
 - Se você é uma mãe que amamenta, toma medicamentos, ou tem problemas médicos críticos, informe o ICE imediatamente.
 - o Se você tiver um cônjuge, pais ou filhos residentes permanentes ou cidadãos americanos, e mora nos Estados Unidos há mais de 10 anos, informe o ICE imediatamente.
 - o Se você tem medo de retornar ao seu país, informe o ICE imediatamente.

O QUE VOCÊ PODE FAZER AGORA PARA SE PREPARAR PARA UMA POSSÍVEL DETENÇÃO:

Há certas coisas que você pode fazer hoje para se preparar para um possível contato com a imigração no futuro.

- Se você é representado pela Fuerza Immigration Lawyers, LLP, memorize nosso número de telefone para que possa nos ligar. Se você não tiver nosso número memorizado, peça ao seu paralegal uma cópia de sua Consentimento de Comunicação a Terceiros para confirmar que você autorizou um contato de emergência para falar conosco sobre o seu caso se você for detido. Memorize o número deles também.
- Certifique-se de ter evidências de sua presença física nos Estados Unidos por pelo menos <u>dois anos</u>. Isso pode incluir cópias de recibos de pagamento, certificados educacionais ou carteira de motorista vencida.
- Tenha dinheiro pronto para fiança e fale com uma pessoa de confiança que possa postar em seu nome se você for detido. O valor mínimo do título é de \$1,500 e não há limite superior. A fiança precisa ser paga em dinheiro.
- Tenha dinheiro para contratar um advogado de imigração se você for detido.
- Considere a execução de um plano de preparação familiar. Veja o exemplo de autorização incluído neste pacote. Se você for detido, é importante considerar quem vai buscar seus filhos na escola, quem poderá levá-los ao médico e quem vai cuidar deles se você for detido. Certifique-se de compartilhar este plano com seus filhos também.
- Se você tiver antecedentes criminais, fale com um advogado criminal sobre como desocupar seus registros por violações constitucionais, se puder.

Como lembrete, se você tiver contato com o ICE ou qualquer funcionário da imigração:

- 1. Você tem o direito de permanecer em silêncio.
- 2. Não assine nada.
- 3. Peça para falar com seu advogado e consulte um juiz de imigração.

Se você tiver alguma dúvida, ligue para seu assistente legal para agendar uma consulta com seu advogado. Estamos mais do que felizes em fornecer informações e orientações durante esses tempos incertos.

Você tem direitos constitucionais:

- NÃO ABRA A PORTA se um agente de imigração estiver a bater à norta
- NÃO RESPONDA A NENHUMA PERGUNTA de um agente de imigração se este tentar falar consigo. Tem o direito de permanecer em silêncio
- NÃO ASSINE NADA sem falar primeiro com um advogado. Você tem o direito de falar com um advogado.
- Se estiver fora da sua casa, pergunte ao agente se tem autorização para ir embora, e, se ele disser que sim, retire-se calmamente.
- ENTREGUE ESTE CARTÃO AO AGENTE. Se estiver dentro da sua casa, mostre o cartão através da janela ou passe-o por baixo da porta.

I do not wish to speak with you, answer your questions, or sign or hand you any documents based on my 5th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution.

I do not give you permission to enter my home based on my 4th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution unless you have a warrant to enter, signed by a judge or magistrate with my name on it that you slide under the door.

I do not give you permission to search any of my belongings based on my 4th Amendment rights.

I choose to exercise my constitutional rights.

These cards are available to citizens and noncitizens alike.
